Grade 7 Science

In Grade 7 Science, we are working on our unit "Plants for Food and Fibre". We are learning about how plants function, what they are made of, and how they are used for different purposes. We have talked about how water moves from the roots of the plant to the leaves of the plant. We are currently doing an experiment with celery and coloured water to answer the question of "How does water move through a plant?"



Grade 8 Science
