7. Vice-Principal Report

- a. Learning Support for students starting off with meeting all of the kids and working on relationships and bonding within the classroom. Going over routines and procedures. The more predictable and structured the routine can be, the more learning that can occur.
- b. Baseline assessments LENS assessment government is asking us to do assessments in grades 2 and 3 to see where and if deficits occur and there could be more funding for the students. We want to find out where the students are at and teach them from there. Students in grades 2 to 8 are doing a math assessment called the MIPI we find out who needs extra support and can fill in the gaps. Students in grades 5 to 8 will be doing a STAR reading assessment this is new to the division this year. Will help us to see who needs support. Students in grades 2 to 4 will do a Fountas and Pinnell reading assessment to check fluency, accuracy and comprehension. HLAT writing assessment will also be done. This is a good indicator to see the flow in the writing. The goal of any assessment is what can I do to help the student grow. Encouraging small group teaching to encourage students to grow.
