

Meeting Minutes

Date: Wednesday, September 24, 2025

Time called to order: 6:16pm

Present: Christie Cameron, Mike Daly, Erin Quinn

Minutes:

1. We opted not to introduce school council as we did not meet the quota.

2. Principal's report:

- a. Mr. Daly reviewed the enrollment data. He pointed out that we are down about 30 students overall. All city schools have decreased in numbers. Most students have moved out of the area.
- b. Mr. Daly presented an overview of staffing, introducing changes in teaching staff.
- c. Mr. Daly presented a review of AERR data. There are several items that are Very Low, such as Welcoming, Caring, Respectful, and Safe Learning Environments, Access to Support and Services, and Parental Involvement. We scored High on Educational Quality. One thing to highlight is the Program of Studies. We dropped from High to Low on School Improvement. We have begun to collect data around school satisfaction. We are hopeful that these scores will increase this year.
- d. We highlighted our W.o.W. Days initiative. Mr. Daly shared highlights from our first field trip. Mr. Daly shared that the students did pre- and post-activities, which connects to mental health, background knowledge, and self-improvement. Parent involvement has been fantastic. Powerschool parent access has jumped from 0% to 80%. The board of trustees is supporting half the cost of this initiative.
- e. Mr. Daly introduced the Restorative Practice initiative. We received a grant to support the restorative practices at Parkdale. This program also comes with funds for assessments for Psych Ed testing, FASD, and other assessments. Mr. Daly outlined how these circles can be used for conflict resolution and community building. The ultimate goal is to divert students from the criminal justice system. Ms. Julie and Ms. Amanda are our restorative practice practitioners.



- f. We are continuing our Seven Grandfather teachings as a focus in our assemblies. We will recognize students for embodying the Grandfather teachings.
- g. We highlighted the CTF options. We have increased choice in Day 3 options.
- h. Parent-Teacher Interviews will be on November 6th from 4:30 7:30.
- i. Our first pizza day is October 2nd.
- j. We highlighted sports Cross-Country is popular with grades 3-5. We have a few students joining volleyball with Queen E.
- k. Photo Day is scheduled for October 9th.
- I. Christie brought up the need for effective communication with parents to communicate opportunities for parental involvement.
